The Centre for Design (C4D) was established within the National Design Innovation Hub under the Enterprise **Ireland Regional Enterprise Development Programme**.

C4D was established by ITC with the support of Kilkenny County Council, Glanbia, Cartoon Saloon, DCCol, Kilkenny Leader Partnership, and KIDCO.

The Centre commenced operations in **March 2020**



A commercial manager and a design specialist are funded through the project. C4D is currently located in McDonagh Junction.




