JV Partnership formed KCC and ISIF KCC brings land as equity and ISIF bring loan funding. 60% of original plan area remaining in public ownership.

Failte Ireland funding for related projects.

What has happened since 2015?

- National Planning Framework in 2018
 Overarching framework for Ireland's growth and development up to 2040
- National Development Plan (2018)
 It introduced new funding mechanisms through the Urban Regeneration and
 Development Fund (URDF). KCC have availed of €xxm to date
- **Building Heights Guidelines** introduced in 2018 encourage the provision of increased building heights in appropriate urban locations.
- The Climate Action Plan (2021)
 Whole-of-Government plan for Ireland achieve a 51% reduction in overall greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 and net-zero emissions by 2050.
- The Town Centre First Policy (2022)
 Make town centres as attractive and functional locations in which people can live, work and visit.
- Land Development Agency
 Remit to deliver housing on public lands



What has happened since 2015?



- Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy for the Southern Region (2020)
 Kilkenny recognised as a Key Town for the region, and seeks to strengthen the role of Kilkenny City as an economic driver for the region.
- Housing for All 2021
 Government's ambitious plan for housing delivery up to 2030. It sets a target to deliver 33,000 new homes per annum
- Kilkenny City and County Development Plan 2021-2027
 Implement National Policy at local level particularly in relation to compact growth and town centre first.
- Kilkenny Climate Action Plan nearing Draft Stage
 Currently in Draft stage (Draft Pan Oct '23)
- Kilkenny city Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan (SUMP)
 Sustainable Transport policies being developed. Finalised 2024

Urban Design Code adopted 2018

Land use mix, short medium and long-term areas for phasing Sequence of development set out









- Commercial viability of the site








The Brief

Extend the Plan Area to include:

- Area bounded by Vicar St/Green Bridge St
- Engineers block,
- Review the phasing
- Extend the principles of the Urban Design Code,
- Advise on housing delivery,
- Review the height restrictions, (Tall buildings)
- Climate Action Adaptation/Mitigation
- Advise on the mix of uses already set out,
- Advise on the accessibility to/from the area

All in the context of new and revised policy since 2015







Commenced Nov. 2022

Public Consultation

- Online questionnaire 274 responses
 60% of participants felt the 2015 vision was still relevant.
- 18th January 2023 an online public consultation event 52 particpants
- Briefing of members March 2023
- Draft Masterplan Guide on public display from Friday June 2nd to Friday June 30th June,
- 20th and 21^{st of} June 2023 offline and online public consultation sessions
- Online briefing session with KCC members 20th June








Summary of Guide Document Provisions.

Document to be used in conjunction with 2015 Masterplan and 2018
Urban Design Guide.
Where conflict arises the Masterplan Guide will take precedence


- Builds on good work already carried out,
- Prioritises Housing delivery on Sweeny's Orchard
- Supports a more flexible application of the UD Code design guidance- allow best practice placemaking in line with the overall vision
- Identifies key frontages, nodes and gathering spaces for targetted active frontages,
- Focused 'nodal points' to help people navigate;
- Support the Medieval City with a different, complimentary, form of development; larger floorplates, flexibile internal layouts, controlled environments,
- Set the stage for Kilkenny City to become a National leader in decarbonisation, low emissions, sustainable town-centre living,
- Linking in to Kilkenny City as a Decarbonisation Zone under the Climate Action Plan








Immediate phase

Mature phase






Main Issues


- Housing on Sweeney's Orchard- priority
- A new Street linking Greens Bridge St & St Francis Abbey Bridge
- Parking to be provided on Sweeneys Orchard of the order of 200 spaces (All subject to detailed design and Separate consent process)
- Urban Design solutions to be advanced for both ends of Vicar Street
- (30-35)% of overall development for housing to be maintained.
- Building Heights of 4/5 as a baseline, whilst maintaining a non-linear roof profile over long blocks
